2015 November President's Letter

On **12th October** the club was welcomed to the National Library of Scotland to view some items from their US and the Commonwealth collection in a private showing by the curator, Dora Petherbridge. We saw letters and documents written and signed by George Washington, Alexander Hamilton, and John Hancock, to name a few. We heard excerpts from the diary of Henrietta Liston, the wife of the second British ambassador to the United States. The couple (both Scots) became friends of George and Martha Washington. It was a moving experience to see and hear about lives from the past of our two countries.

The club has selected **Move On** as the **Scottish local charity** that our fund-raising activities shall support for the next two years. Its headquarters are in Glasgow, and it has a vibrant local Edinburgh center, as well. The charity supports programs to help youth age 16-24 who are, or have been,

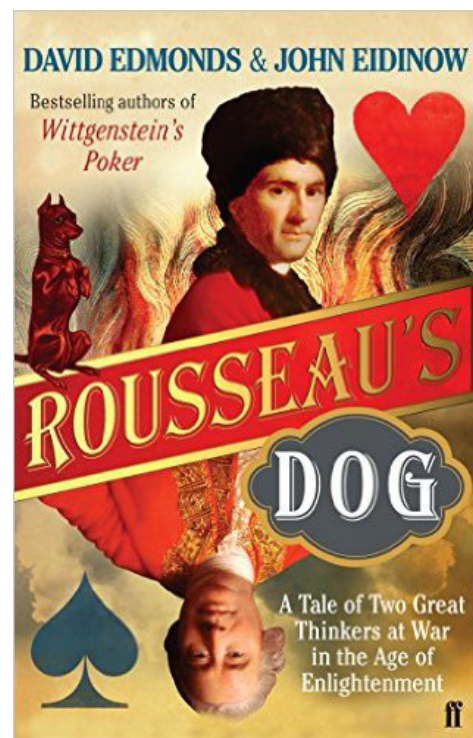

This is the true story of the bitter and public quarrel between the Scottish philosopher David Hume and the French philosopher Jean Jacques Rousseau, who was a fugitive and considered a madman in his home country, a quarrel that arose after Hume invited Rousseau and his dog Sultan to refuge in England.

It includes the work of painters who were born in Scotland and travelled abroad, such as Allan Ramsay and Sir David Wilkie, and of those whose inspiration remained firmly rooted in their native land, such as Alexander Nasmyth and James Giles. In particular, the exhibition highlights the importance and influence of artists whose work was shaped by the ideas of the Scottish Enlightenment.

The Quarterly magazine carries articles of interest to "repatriates," and you may apply for the FAUSA Education Award for yourself or a child. In addition, FAUSA members may attend the FAWCO conferences overseas and the FAUSA Annual Meeting, which is in a different part of the US every fall.
