given a great price—28.00 pounds per member or member's family!

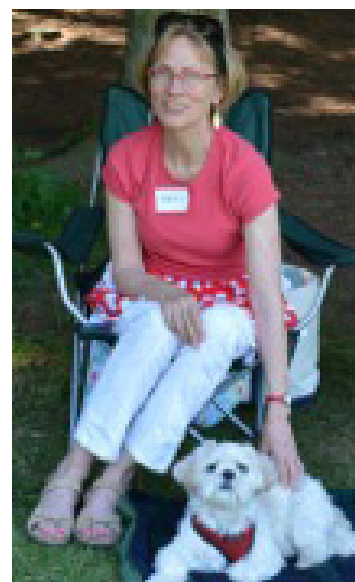

Read the list and duties of the officers of the AWCCS-- you may run for any of the first 9 offices. At the AGM on June 2nd we will vote for officers for the next year.

A. Board of Directors

1. President
2. Vice -President
3. Secretary
4. Treasurer
5. Social Chairperson
6. Charity Chairperson
7. Membership Chairperson
8. Newsletter Editor
9. Public Relations Chairperson
10. FAWCO Representative- appointed position

B. Appointed Positions: The president shall nominate appointees and the elected officers shall approve the following positions;

1. Honorary President: Offered to the American Consul General, if female, or the wife of the American Consul General if in residence.
2. Glasgow Representative: Helps to organise activities in Glasgow and brings any issues from that area to the board.
3. Web site Manager: Responsible for maintaining the club's web site.
4. Such other positions, as the Board of Directors may deem necessary.

ARTICLE V - Duties of officers

Section 1. The President

The President shall preside at all the meetings of the club using ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER NEWLY REVISED and be an ex- officio member of all committees. The President shall be the primary representative of the club to the community. The President shall ensure that an annual budget is drawn up by the Board early in its term and presented to Club members in the November newsletter.

Section 2. Vice-President

The Vice President shall assist the President and preside in the President's absence. The Vice President shall have charge of programming and selection of venue for the monthly meetings.

Section 3. Secretary

The Secretary shall keep minutes of Board meetings and general Club meetings ensuring that all voting is in accordance with ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER NEWLY REVISED.

Section 4. Treasurer

The Treasurer shall be custodian of all Club funds including receipt and expenditure of such funds. All bills shall be sent to the Treasurer, documented by invoice. The Treasurer shall give the Board a monthly report of all receipts and expenditures. The Treasurer shall prepare a preliminary statement of income and expenditure for the year, to be published in the June newsletter. A final statement shall be prepared subsequently for the Board and published in (in) the October newsletter. The Treasurer shall keep a Petty Cash account of not more than £20 for incidental Club expenses and reimbursements. The Treasurer will work with the President and the Board to develop the yearly budget.

Section 5. Membership Committee Chairperson

The Membership Chairperson shall be responsible for compiling and keeping a correct list of members, for collecting the membership fees, for regularly updating a membership directory and for maintaining a Resource Book which is available on the web site. The Membership renewal fees shall be collected from all members once a year starting from October. The Membership shall present a "AWCCS Club membership status" report to the Board at the February meeting. Membership is responsible for being the first contact with prospective members.

Section 6. Newsletter Editor

The Newsletter Editor is responsible for producing and disbursing at least 9 newsletters annually to all Club members, sponsors, and appropriate FAWCO officers.

Section 7. Advertising and Publicity Chairperson

The A/P Chairperson is responsible for securing advertisements for the Club newsletter and seeking continued support from advertisers. The A/P Chairperson will maintain accurate billing and collections from all advertisers. When appropriate the AP Chairperson will promote the Club and its activities in the community and may seek sponsorship for club events and publication.

Section 8. Social Chairperson

The Social Chairperson shall coordinate the Thanksgiving and 4th of July events for the Club.

Section 9. Charity Chairperson

The Charity Chairperson shall coordinate charity fund raising by the club to raise funds for our designated charity and help to identify the latter every two years.

Section 10. FAWCO Representative

The FAWCO (Federation of American Women's Clubs Overseas) Representative serves as a liaison between FAWCO and the AWCCS, shall communicate as necessary with FAWCO organisations, and shall ensure that annual dues and, when appropriate, donations are paid to FAWCO. This is an appointed position.

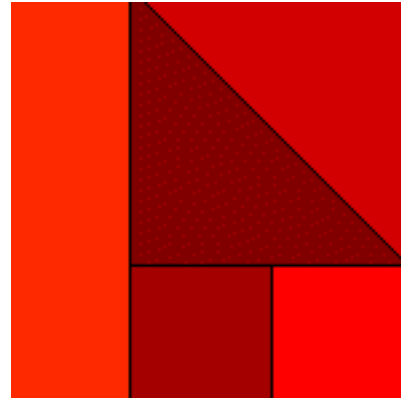

FAWCO Friendship Quilt 2015 "Liberare"

Now for the 2016 instructions! I really wanted a special block signifying women's rights to go with the final year of the Target Project, but the traditional ones seem too complex for a 6" block. You'll need 5 different colors. Please use solid colors, no prints. Use 100% cotton. Be very precise so that your block measures exactly 6.5 inches (which will finish to a 6" block when everything is sewn together). So go to the link and follow the steps! (Sewing instructions are on page 1, cutting instructions on page 2. Just ignore her suggestions for making this into an entire quilt!) Then sign your block using either embroidery or a Pigma pen (0.5mm permanent archive quality).

The deadline, as usual, is October 10, 2015.

This year, my calendar will be tight and I really do plan to start putting it together the day after the deadline, so NO EXTENSIONS! The best plan would be to get your block finished before the summer so you have plenty of time to show it off to your club. You could mail it to me early -my mailbox is waiting!

P.S. A couple of people have already asked about colors for this quilt. I'd like solids (or tone-on-tone almost-solids), but any color you want. (No novelty prints, no 2-color prints...)

Yes, you may do more than one block. Yes, you may sign your club's name, or your name, or both. (But no date, that will go on the label.)

Recipes!

FLAMING BANANAS

From Lupe Pinto's book *Two Cooks and a Suitcase*. Lupe Pinto's has been an advertiser in the American Women's Club newsletter for over 12 years.

Ingredients

6 bananas (sliced)
125 g butter
120 muscovado sugar
2 Tbsp Cointreau
2 Tbsp Rum
6 Scoops vanilla ice cream

Directions: Melt the butter in a large frying pan and stir in the sugar until completely dissolved. Place the banana slices in the pan and cook until soft.

Stir in the Cointreau.

Heat the rum in a ladle or small pan until hot—do not boil—ignite, and pour over the bananas, stirring in until the flames die down.

Place a scoop of ice cream in each dish and spoon pieces of banana and some sauce over each one.

Serve immediately. (6 servings)

Mediterranean COUSCOUS - Nancy Lynner

I made this without dairy, to accommodate allergies.

INGREDIENTS

1 cup dry Cous cous
2 cups water or chicken stock
Black olives, sliced
Green olives, sliced
Chopped zucchini
Sliced cherry tomatoes

DRESSING:

1 jar Basil Pesto
¼ cup Olive oil
Juice 1 small lemon

PROCEDURE

Boil water/ stock in pan, and add dry couscous, all sliced olives, chopped zucchini, and let sit for 5 minutes or more.

Fluff cous cous with a fork.

Mix the dressing, pour onto the cous cous. Stir and fluff with fork.

Refrigerate.

30 minutes prior to serving, remove from refrigerator and serve room temperature
